Registered nurses in primary care are also known as "family practice nurses" and "primary care nurses"

THE REGISTERED NURSE MAY:



provide prenatal care, well-baby check-ups, pap and annual exams

help you navigate the healthcare system and transitions between settings



perform routine immunizations

conduct preventative screening



coordinate and implement primary care-based programs for healthy living

connect/refer you to other professionals, services and support in your community





provide mental health and addictions support

work with you to understand your medications





support illness management (diabetes, asthma, COPD, heart disease, high blood pressure, etc.)

provide health education



Registered nurses in primary care serve INDIVIDUALS OF ALL AGES and form LONG TERM, CONTINUOUS relationships with patients



There are specific competencies that guide their practice. They include:

- 1 professionalism
- 4 collaboration and partnership
- 2 clinical practice
- quality assurance, evaluation and research
- (3) communication
- (6) leadership

Depending on the reason for your visit, you may see a registered nurse and another member of the healthcare team.

There may also be times when you only see the registered nurse.
